



Grant Service Pricing Options

1. Grant Research

The number one difficulty to increase grant dollars is knowing where to look for up-to-date grant sources. Brock Academic Services and Editing uses four different specialized databases, as well as conducting independent research, to find grant makers that match the nonprofit's funding needs.

Our comprehensive grant research pinpoints searches based on programmatic keywords, geographic region, funding levels, funding priorities and delivers a comprehensive report to the nonprofit containing all the contact information, deadlines, and pertinent information needed to take next steps towards applying.

There are options for conducting grant scans in real time or over the course of 1 week to 3 months to find as many viable funding sources as possible.

Pricing for various levels of grant research include:

- **Primary Grant Scan \$100**

This is a grant scan of possible funders for a specific funding need that is compiled in real time. The scan includes an analysis from four search databases to yield the greatest number of possible results. Typically, a Primary Grant Scan will reveal multiple possibilities, but there are no guaranteed results in terms of a number of funders provided. It is the responsibility of the non-profit to further assess readiness to apply, contact the funder with further questions, and submit an LOI (Letter of Intent) if desired.

- **Focused Grant Scan \$500**

Platforms can update grant opportunities daily, so the scan is repeated at least once a week for three consecutive weeks to catch new grant opportunities populated into the system. This approach allows for more variation on keywords and funding priorities to navigate deeper into possible matches. The final report is replete with funder contact information, specific priorities, funding limits, application timelines, deadlines, and associated notes. If desired, Brock Academic Services and Editing staff will contact funders on the nonprofit's behalf to ascertain readiness for grant submission. It will then be the responsibility of the non-profit to submit an LOI (Letter of Intent) or grant application for consideration.

- **Extensive Grant Scan \$1000**

Brock Academic Services and Editing team will become an extended arm of a nonprofit's development efforts for a period of 3 months. During this engagement, focused grant scans of proposed project and organizational needs will be conducted weekly and periodic meetings will take place to assess grant readiness. Potential grant makers that have been identified as priority opportunities will be contacted on behalf of the organization to determine LOI and grant application probability. It will then be the responsibility of the non-profit to submit an LOI (Letter of Intent) or grant application for consideration.

2. Grant Writing

Brock Academic Services and Editing team can write and submit proposals on behalf of a nonprofit. Brock Academic Services and Editing will only write and submit proposals that are deemed to be competitive and in-line with funder requirements. **There is no expressed guarantee that grants will be awarded.** If denied, part of the proposal writing process includes follow up with the funder to determine factors that could make the application successful in future funding cycles.

Pricing for other available grant services:

- **Proposal Writing**

Pricing for proposal writing is determined by the level of complexity of the application and the type of proposal being sought. An economy of scale is typically agreed upon between a nonprofit and Brock Academic Services and Editing. The type of proposal a nonprofit may seek can be from either a private or public foundation, a city or county government, or a federal agency. Typical pricing in these various categories are as follows:

- ☐ Private or Public Foundation \$500
- ☐ City or County Government \$750
- ☐ Federal Entity \$1,000

- **Proposal Editing and Review**

Nonprofits who have internal grant professionals, or want to develop their own proposal, can benefit from professional editing and review services. Brock Academic Services and Editing team will carefully edit and provide comments on grants before they are submitted to a funder for consideration. Included in this service is a review of the scoring criteria and guidance documents to ensure applications are as competitive as possible. Editing and review services are priced in accordance with the type of proposal being submitted.
